

NANAMIC Update March 2019

Thoughts from the chair

There has once again been a significant interest in the post-16 sector and a number of developments of which you need to be aware.

Our friends at MEI have been allocated funding by the Nuffield Foundation to develop a new GCSE mathematics curriculum which is more relevant to post-16 students. Check the appropriate page on the Nuffield website to found out how this is progressing.

On a similar theme, the <u>government</u> has announced that those who achieved Grade 2 or below in GCSE mathematics can now follow a purely functional skills route up to Level 2 and do not need to take GCSE re-sit. The Open University and 3 Further Education colleges have produced an online 48 hours course for Level 1 Functional Skills with the title <u>Everyday maths</u>. They hope to roll out a level 2 course soon and then some sector specific courses. The materials are free to use for students and providers.

The Right Honourable Robert Halfon MP is chairman of the Education Select Committee and has been making significant statements about F.E funding and GCSE resits. Follow @nanamiccio on Twitter to keep up to date with the latest news.

For the past few years there has been bursary scheme for new maths graduates who wish to enter teaching in F.E. many of us have been opposed to this method of recruitment on a number of grounds including the fact that a good graduate does not necessarily make a good teacher and also the statement: "trainees are expected to enter a teaching post in the FE sector in England". They are not required to pay back the £2500 if they do not enter the FE sector. The government has announced that this funding will cease from August 2019.

Finally, there has been a change regarding the timetable for the mathematics associations joining to form a new association and we will not be putting any proposal to our members until at least our AGM in July. However, there is a statement explaining about this opportunity of joining together on page 4 and there is a link to Frequently Asked Questions on our website.

Thank you to those who have renewed their membership for 2019. It is not too late for you to renew or to join for the first time. The cost is only £20 for the year.

New association

We are pleased to announce that there has been an exciting development for the community of those involved, or interested in, mathematics education for students of any age or level. Plans are reaching a crucial stage in the creation of a single mathematical subject association, the Association for Mathematics Education (AME). Currently there are five associations and many teachers, or others, are not sure which one to join. We hope that this will not be a problem in the future as there will be a new single charity to represent the whole sector.

Whether you teach mathematics full-time or part-time, specialising or teaching it alongside other subjects or whether you just have an interest in mathematics education, this new association will be for you. Your institution will also be able to join.

Mathematics is taught in a wide variety of settings: early years, primary schools, secondary schools, colleges, secure estates, adult and community education, higher education and through private training providers. How brilliant it would be if all these sectors were represented by one organisation which could speak independently, but with a richness of input, on behalf of the whole community.

Discussions have been taking place for some time between the Association of Mathematics Education Teachers (AMET), the Association of Teachers of Mathematics (ATM), the Mathematical Association (MA), the National Association of Mathematical Advisors (NAMA) and the National Association for Numeracy and Mathematics in Colleges (NANAMIC). These associations have different emphases which will continue to be valued by the new charity. As part of the initial structure, Special Interest Groups will maintain these emphases.

The next stage is for each organisation to commit to moving forwards and then produce a 'due diligence' report to ensure that it is in the best interests of their members to proceed with transferring memberships, funds and other resources to the new charity. A proposal will then go to the relevant trustees for their approval before it is presented to the members of each organisation.

This is a thrilling opportunity for the mathematics education community to work together to impact mathematics teaching and policy for many years to come. Diversity within unity is strength.


